Declaration of "Year of the Scout"

Do you know that 2008 is the 100 year of Australian Scouting?

On 4 May, the Hon John Howard, Prime Minister, announced that the Australian Government had declared 2008 as the Year of the Scout. He also announced that the Royal Australian Mint will strike a circulating coin, in addition to 3 commemorative coins. These announcements are in recognition of the contribution Scouting has made to our nation over the past 100 years, and will continue to make.

This will be a good opportunity for all of us to promote Scouts throughout our communities in 2008 our year of Scouting in Australia.

Remember that our Regional Office has promotional material to help your Group promote Scouting and to recruit at the same time.

EXPLANATION OF SCOUTING

"From the national point of view our aim is solely to make the rising generation into good citizens.

We do not interfere with the boy's religion, of whatever form it may be, though we encourage him to practise whichever he professes.

Our training divides itself under four heads:—

- 1 Individual character training in resourcefulness, observation, self-reliance to gain the Scout's Badge.*
- 2 Handicrafts or hobbies which may help a boy to make his way in life, for which we give "Proficiency" badges.*
- 3 Physical Health, by encouraging the boy to take plenty of exercise and to look after his body.*
- 4 Service for the State, such as fire brigade, ambulance, missionaries, life-saving, or other collective public duty by the troop.*

Scouting appeals to boys of every class, and can be carried out in towns just as well as in the country.

When a Scoutmaster has not sufficient knowledge in any one subject he can generally get a friend who is an expert to come and give his troop the required instructions."

This is an extract from Scouting for Boys by Lord Baden-Powell. Reading this, Scouting today is much the same.

Cooking

Dog in a blanket -- Wrap a Hot Dog in dough, skewer on a stick and bake over hot coals. Or slit the hot dog and insert a piece of cheese before you wrap and cook it.

Banana Hot Boat -- Cut a v-shaped wedge from the top of an unpeeled banana. Fill wedge with pieces of chocolate and marshmallow. Wrap in foil and place on coals for 8-10 minutes.

Potato -- Cut out the centre of a potato. Fill with hamburger and diced onion, or with butter and cheese. Plug the hole with some of the pieces you removed. Wrap in foil and bake in coals. Cook for about an hour.

Games

Racing Cars

Equipment: 1 stick and 1 paper cup per team, plus chalk

Rules: Draw a giant figure of eight on the hall floor, to be the racing track. Put Scouts in equal teams in the 4 corners behind the racing track. Ask the 1st Scout from each team to place his cup on the floor with his stick inside it so that it can be pushed around the track like a racing car. On "Go" the 1st Scouts form each team race around the track, pushing their "cars" in the designated direction.

At the intersection, right of way is given to the first car to arrive there. Racers must not overtake each other on the track but must continue around till they get home and had the racing cars to the next in their team. First team all home, and sitting down, is the winning team.

Backbreaking Skittles

Equipment: Several light/soft footballs, Six plastic skittles and Chalk (or string to divide area).

Game Description: This is best played in an enclosed area such as a hall.

Divide your area in half with a chalk line, which is not to be crossed by either team. Select two equal teams. Place three skittles per team equally spaced across the hall about 20 feet back from the line, in each team's territory. The idea is for each team to knock down all three of the opposing team's skittles, whilst defending their own. Several balls are used at once, however they can only be reclaimed from within the team's own territory, no crossing the line. The winning team's score is the number of their own skittles standing once the other teams are all knocked down. A number of rounds can be nominated and the aggregate score calculated for the final score. Players may only throw the balls under-arm. Using back and side walls to rebound off is allowed and is a good way to get round blockers. Teamwork in the form of passing along the line will also help. All players must stay on their feet when blocking incoming balls, and only one player at a time may directly block each skittle.

Cub Scout Capers

Allergic Reactions to Different Foods

The Region had a medical incident with one of our youth members recently and it could have been very serious for the person involved. I was asked how we could manage or minimize the risk of this happening to another youth member. As we have members with food allergies ranging from mild to severe. It is the severe reactions we must minimise/manage those whilst in our care and thus demonstrate our understanding and commitment to the wellbeing of the members of our Association.

After discussions with medical personnel regarding the best ways we can approach food allergies the consensus was: Cooking on Pack nights or items brought into the Pack for challenge badges must be accompanied by a list of ingredients. A verbal list of ingredients can not be accepted as the person who is providing the information may not know the full detail.

I will elaborate in greater detail when I visit your District and will explain the reasons to your DCSL as well.

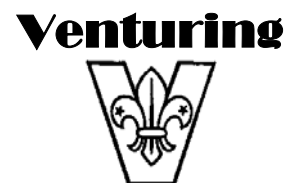
International

Training Rebate Scheme – Great for Groups

Great news! The Training Rebate Scheme will continue. Since January 1 2006 the State has returned to groups within this region 75% of course fees for Trainee Leaders who complete Basic Training (certificate 111 in Business (Frontline) Management). The Branch Executive Council continues to recognise the strength that can be added to Scouting by having Leaders who complete Advanced Training have achieve a Wood Badge. To support this all Groups receive 75% of course fees back for each Leader of the group who complete Wood Badge/ Certificate IV in Business (Frontline) Management. This program has been extended and will apply for next year.

Course Closing Dates / Course Numbers

It's incredible that I consistently write about course numbers and it still doesn't seem to be getting through judging by the last minute applications to attend courses. For those that have complied and get applications in early, thank you. For those that have not please read on. Course numbers are strictly limited to a maximum of 30. Participants will be

accepted on a first in basis till we reach 30 when the course will close. There will be no exceptions to this rule. Closing dates are 3 weeks prior to the course running. It may be possible to run an additional course if numbers are sufficient. However trying to source an additional team in three weeks before a course is extremely difficult however if I knew six weeks from the published course date that numbers were sufficient to run a second course then it would be easier to source a team. When participants apply right on closing then this is almost impossible to manage. Successful courses don't just happen they rely on highly effective course management and planning. I strongly advise Group Leaders to facilitate submission of forms as soon as possible and not wait to avoid the frustration of leaders missing out on courses.

Small Mobs – a "reprint"

Last Bulletin I wrote an article about small Mobs. I am pleased to say that one Group contacted me. I know they are not the only Group so I have decided to run the notice again this month in case Group Leaders and Joey Leaders missed it last month.

ATTENTION: GROUP LEADERS AND JOEY SCOUT LEADERS –

Mobs with Small youth Membership

Several times now I have asked for Mobs who have low youth members to contact their District Leaders to talk about how we can help you to increase your Mob size.

There has been no response to this request.

You may ask why do I keep asking to help? Most Mobs who continue to maintain small youth membership are in danger of closing within a few years.

Why?

1. Programming for small Mobs is much harder than it is for larger mobs; as you go through the activities much quicker therefore you need to add much more to the program or your program delivery falls short.
2. Leaders run out of ideas much quicker when trying to program for small number and end up burning out and this can possibly lead to resignation.
3. Small numbers discourages new families from joining your Mob. It is a bit like joining a sinking ship. As a parent I would look and the situation and not feel that Joey Scouts can be that exciting after all there are only a couple of children there. How exciting can that be if no one wants to join!
4. If those couple of Joey Scouts advance or leave what happens to the Mob? Does it simply close or does the Group have to start the Mob all over again. This situation ends up in the too hard basket for many Groups or has to utilise everyone in the Group to try and get it going again, which is fine I guess if the Group have the time!

I would like any Group Leader or Joey Scout Leader to contact their District Joey Scout Leader or me and at least discuss ways the Section maybe able to help improve Mob numbers in your Groups.

During the next few months I will be at your District Wandarrah's and visiting Groups to discuss the help options available to assist with increasing Mob membership.

You can get in early and contact us to get your Mob bouncing again!!!!
