YOUR SCOUT HERITAGE

THOMAS R. ROYDHOUSE of "The Sunday Times" Part 2

Following the historic meeting on the 28th March 1908, "The Sunday Times" became the registration point for Patrols.

Mr. Roydhouse visited schools and groups of people speaking to them about Lt. General Baden Powell's Scouts. His historic announcement on 28th June 1908 in "The Sunday Times" published an article by Baden Powell telling of the new movement for boys in England.

"The League was formed by Lt. General Baden Powell and some outline of it is given on this page.

It will help to make good citizens as well as good Scouts. At present, it is only operating in Great Britain, but we think it will extend over the Empire.

We hope to see an Australian section of the League and will be prepared to act with schoolmasters to that end.

HOW TO BECOME A SCOUT. Information was issued to boys in Great Britain through "The Scout" - the publication of the League.

To become a Boy Scout, you join a Patrol belonging to your Cadet Corps or Boys Brigade or Club. If you are not a member of one of these, you can raise a Patrol yourself by getting five other boys to join. They should, if possible, be all about the same age. One boy is then chosen as Patrol Leader to command the Patrol. He then selects another boy to be Corporal or Second or Second in Command. Several Patrols together may form a Troop under an officer called a Scout Master."

So it can be seen how this great Scout Movement began and how the spontaneous enthusiasm for the new programme was grasped by boys from all walks of life.

Mr. Thomas Richard Roydhouse of "The Sunday Times" certainly deserves his niche in the Scouting history of Australia. He died on 27th May 1943.

WHAT TO DO!

Groups can reduce the risk of all these events by the simple and cheap installation of PIR's. PIR's, (Passive Inferred Sensors) are often used around houses to turn lights on when someone walks nearby.

THE TRICK!

Connect your PIR to the inside lights or light so when it is activated people will think there is someone inside the building.

NEXT AND MOST IMPORTANT!

Set the PIR timer to stay on for 30 minutes or so. This will look more convincing to the hoons hanging around.

Your Movement

Following from last month:

In 1909 Scouting sets up its own H.Q. at 116-118 Victoria St, London S.W.1.

First edition of the *Headquarters Gazette* is published – a monthly magazine for the leaders of the Movement. The Crystal Palace Rally takes place, the first great rally in the Movement's history. There are 11,000 Scouts present and magnificent displays of Scouting. The King sends a message of congratulation. Appearance of so-called "Girl Scouts" leads to Girl Guides as a separate organisation. The rally is followed by a Conference of Scoutmasters at which the Scouts' duty to God is emphasised. At this conference the term "Scouts Own" is used for the first time. B.P. holds a camp partly at Bucklers Hard, Hampshire, and partly on board the Training Ship *Mercury*. (This is really the beginning of Sea Scouts although they are not officially recognised till 1912.)

In 1910 The Silver Wolf to be awarded to any King's Scout who has gained 24 Proficiency Badges. Scouts with all-round cords to be allowed to draw a Stafford Knot after their signature, a King's Scout a crown, a Silver Wolf Scout a wolf. B.P. tours Canada with two Patrols of Scouts. First census of the Movement in Great Britain taken: 109,000. (from *Your Movement - The Patrol Books No. 20* edited by Rex Hazlewood)

Games

Queen Tag

Equipment: None

Game Description:

1. Players pair up & stand in a circle. Each pair is arranged so that they are standing facing inwards, one of the

pair behind the other. Space them out so that there is enough room to run between the pairs.

2. Choose a pair to be Chaser and Chased. Send one to opposite side of circle to start the game.

3. The Chaser then tries to catch the Chased. They must run in and out of the circle & not vanish off into the distance!

4. When the Chased is tired or nearly caught, he stands still in front of one of the pairs in the circle. When he does this, the one at the back of the pair now takes part in the chasing but becomes the CHASER, and the original Chaser becomes the Chased. It can become a quick, non-stop game if the Chased keep standing in front of the pairs in the circle.

5. If someone is caught, they just stand in front of a pair in the circle and the game goes on!

Watch out for:

- the circle getting smaller and smaller as the game goes on. When someone is caught, take the opportunity to move the pairs back out a pace or two.

- the Chased must stand right in front of a pair. If it is not clear which pair he is standing in front of then the game can go wrong with two Chasers!

- make sure everyone gets a go. The Chased do tend to pick their friends so some will get lots of turns & some will get none.

Transport

Equipment: 3 'bases' for example cones with sticks standing in them. Each base has a sign on it with either 'air', 'sea' or 'land' written on it

Game Description:-

Best played outside.

The players start off in the middle of the 3 bases.

The leader calls out different vehicles/modes of transport (Boeing 747 for example) and the players must run to the base which is suitable.

Last one there is out and must stand with the leader - preferably offering other ideas

Very good for tiring out hyperactive children!
