## The Regional Commissioner's Message

### Jean Passes On

On a very sad note, our very recently retired Regional Chairman, Jean Hattander, passed away in the early hours of Sunday 16 September. The previous day, supported by Grahame Pricter and Allan Currie, I presented Jean with her Silver Kangaroo. She was surrounded by family and medical staff and it was (as I am sure that you will appreciate) a very sensitive and emotive time for all concerned. On the following Thursday I was present with a large and diverse number of people at her funeral where I truly appreciated the many people and organisations that Jean had touched and the service was a fitting tribute to her. I was close to her and I will miss her loyalty and support.

### Regional Chairman

I'm sure that you will join me in welcoming our Deputy Regional Commissioner, Allan Currie aboard in his additional role of Regional Chairman. Allan (of course) was Regional Commissioner between 1996 and 2003 and so he brings considerable expertise and ability to the position. ### The Region Centenary Event.

In addition several local dignitaries attended notably including the Lord Mayor of Newcastle, John Tate accompanied by the Lady Mayoress, Cathy Tate. So there were plenty of others to see what was going on. We will ever be indebted for the generosity of the staff of Newcastle City Council without whose advice and cooperation, the event just would not have happened at all.

The prototype of the Centenary Medallion has been sighted and I am sure that all promised made about quality and desirability have been fulfilled. There won't be a youth member who will not want one (nor a leader either for that matter). So if you were at the Centenary Event on the Foreshore, you are in the running to get one. If you are a current registered member and your Group Leader / Crew Leader certifies that you have completed the 100 Point Centenary Challenge, then you are in the list to get a Medallion. It's really that simple, although some work is needed by some. Let me once again confirm my direction on these Medallions, they will NOT be given away to everybody, they must be EARNED. If you are in doubt as to what is needed then your District Commissioner can set you straight. So you have to the end of October (yes this month) to get the 100 Point Challenge completed and then once the lists are in and checked, the Medallions will be issued and you will be the envy of everyone else. The List needs to go to Deputy Regional Commissioner, Colin Paulson who is collating the results and will then check the data. Colin can be contacted via Region Office

We are on a high I know but shortly, yes Christmas is not far away and we will be going into our Member Retention Strategy. Later this month we will announce what the Retention Prize will be and yes it will be a "ripper". Speaking of retention, don't forget that your District Commissioner will at the DCs' Conference on 20 October tell us what each Group intends doing to ensure that youth members return to Scouts after the summer break, in

February. As I have said numerous times, it doesn't matter if the strategy is shared by Groups in Districts but the days are long gone when we can expect our youth members to return to us after 1 February automatically. It has to be MADE happen with something that will bring them back. Some inspirational event or some other strategy with a "WOW! Factor" must be put in place and the time to do so is NOW. So how are you going to do this, have you spoken to your fellow Leaders in other Groups and discussed what they are doing? Networking is one way to get some good ideas here. However doing nothing is not an option, with your positive help we can stop the summer drop and minimise the member leakage at this critical time of year. Keeping 'em should be much easier than recruiting 'em. I look forward to hearing of lots of imaginative plans.

To our Regional Commissioner goes our appreciation for his support and encouragement and to anyone else I may have missed a big thank you from the whole of the Region. This certainly has been the largest activity ever put on this Region and the first time that a Chief Commissioner of Australia has ever visited.

## Smoke Signals



### Dick Smith

Adventurer, Businessman, Publisher and Former Scout

*" I began as a Cub at eight and went right through to Rovers at age 23. I was very much a loner and Scouting gave me mateship, taught me organisation and how to motivate people. That's why I was able to be the success I am.*

*I owe a lot to Scouting. It had to be the most fantastic influence on my life. It taught me responsible risk-taking.*

*My first real expedition was when a group of Rover Scouts and myself organised a sailing boat and sailed to Ball's Pyramid, an incredible rock spire about 300 miles to the east of Sydney. I was about 21 years old and it gave me the kind of experience that helped me to start my business.*

*I've got a tremendous amount to thank the Scouting Movement for. Scouting allows people to be individuals, but also to work as a team. I found in my business that what I'd learnt in my early days in Scouting, to get on with people, was incredibly important."*

In 1966 he was awarded the Baden-Powell Award, the highest award in the Rover Section (17-26 years old) after 14 years in Scouting. In 2005, ABC television's Australian Story had an episode about Dick's remarkable adventures as a Rover.

## Games

### Circle Football

Equipment: Bean bag

The players form a circle and hold hands. A bean bag is placed in the centre of the circle. The idea of the game is to force the bean bag outside the circle. The two players that the bag passes between or under are out of the game. Players are allowed to pull a player over the bean bag or to kick it. If the circle breaks both players at the break are out of the game. The last player left is the winner.

### In the Pond

Equipment: Chalk

The players stand in a large circle just outside the chalk circle. The leader stands in the centre and may say the following commands

"In the Pond!" - all the players jump into the circle

"On the Bank!" - all the players jump out

If a command is given when all the players are already in or out of the Pond it should be ignored. Any other wording should also be ignored (e.g. In the Bank). Any player who makes a mistake is out and sits down. The last player is the winner.

### Squat Tag

Equipment: Chalk, short rope

Mark out a circle in the middle of the room about 3 or metres wide. Two players squat within the circle holding the rope. The object of the game is to get the other player to put any part of their body outside the circle or to let go of the rope.

### Bomb

Equipment: Beanbag

The beanbag represents a ticking bomb. The players run around trying to avoid the bomb. At certain intervals the leader blows the whistle. The player holding the bomb at that time is 'dead'. The bomb can be passed on by a player touching another player. If you are touched you must accept the bomb. Play continues until the last player left in

### Centenary Event

I wish to thank everyone who assisted at the Centenary event - your efforts were amazing!

Although Saturday tested our skills weather wise it did not stop everyone having a great time and of course Sunday was just perfect.

I had a phone call on the Monday after from an acquaintance who told me her thirteen year old grandson went to Nobby's beach for a swim. He and his four friends joined in the Scout celebration. She told me her grandson was ecstatic; he said they had the best time ever! That must be the best feedback we could get to have children outside scouting **ecstatic!**

### Care and Share Month – November 2007

This year for Care and Share, the District Leaders have decided to use the month to assist young children in Cambodia.

The Sunshine Centre is a project that provides before and after school care to around 90 children aged 3-16 years. The programme includes breakfast and a hot lunch, bathing facilities and basic health care. These children used to be too poor to go to school (their families earn less than US\$2.50/day) the children would normally spend their days roaming the streets, trying to earn income, usually by collecting recyclable materials. However, since October last year, the sunshine project has enrolled more than 70 children into government schools, many for the first time in their lives.

The District Leaders have the program for Care and Share and details of how we can participate at your Wandarras during this month.

Below is a rough outline of what is being suggested.

**Week One:** Joeys given a job card for week with 5 slots/parent to sign. When complete we are asking parents to donate \$1 for the Jobs done.

**Week Two:** Run adventure program. There will be two Programs supplied by District Leaders or you can do your own program. Invite families other members of your Group & charge \$1 admission. You could also consider running one program on week two the other in week four or later if you wish.

**Week Three:** Take photos of Joeys. Ask the Joeys to write about themselves, make a lightweight booklet perhaps?

**Please note:** Mail to Cambodia is expensive we need to keep this lightweight.

**Week Four:** Outing – Multicultural Centre, Art Centre, Museum, Go to park & play Cambodian Games, Visit Library & read Cambodian Stories.
