The Regional Commissioner's Message



Up, Up & Away

On a very positive note, I along with Deputy Regional Commissioners' Colin Paulson & Allan Currie, had the wonderful opportunity to visit Stroud on 2nd March to see first hand this new Group in action. From the minute we alighted from our vehicles the positive vibes from the new Youth Members, new Leaders and very importantly the Stroud community was obvious. They wanted Scouting and nothing was going to get in their way to stop it. It was a fantastic night. The looks on people's faces, their body language said it all. It was all a "yes we can do" rather than a "no we can't" attitude. Congratulations to Stroud but very sincere congratulations to Regional Commissioner (School Promotions) Des Hocking who along with District Commissioner Port Stephens, Lee Doyle have worked tirelessly to make it happen.

Also on the "Great News" front is another success story from the Upper Hunter where District Commissioner Stephen Thatcher has reported that Merriwa Group has restarted after many years and that they have 21 new members. This is terrific and I look forward to visiting Merriwa personally very shortly. We also have a new Rover Crew at Newcastle University. Well done again. To finish on new Groups, Greg Green District Commissioner at Manning reports that Taree Group is also back in action after several years lapse. Well done Greg and I'm sure we will see Taree Group grow dramatically. That gives us all up new Groups at Stroud, Denman, Merriwa, Taree and the University Rover Crew. This is clearly going in the right direction.

"Passed" not "Past"

I have just returned from the Chief Commissioner's Council at Pennant Hills over the weekend 12th & 13th March. On

the Sunday State Development Officer John Coleman gave a session on the current position of Scouting in terms of numbers, percentages etc. In fact he had so much data it was unbelievable but very interesting and certainly in some aspects very disturbing. One statistic that knocked me off my seat was the fact that we are closing in average 30 Scout Groups in our State per year. Its mind boggling isn't it with 465 Groups in the State at present. You obviously begin to wonder where this figure is going to stop. DC's were informed by me some time ago that I will not support the closure of any Group unless absolutely all alternatives have been explored. We let them go too easily and our track of restarting Groups is frankly, diabolical. That is even more reason why Stroud, Merriwa and Taree are such encouraging stories. After full consultation with your DC's we are aligning key members with enormous ability and experience to act as mentors to Groups with low numbers to make sure they are not in the list of "Groups of the Past". Sounds dreadful doesn't it but unfortunately it is a reality and we must put sustainable infrastructure in place to overcome these issues to the best of our abilities. Incidentally I've signed up and Lambton-Waratah is the Group I'll be working with and I am looking forward in trying with my last breath (if necessary) to assist this Group. This is no take over by Region nor are we going out there to harass people. It is foremost about giving these people mentoring and support.

The 3 R's (Retain, Recruit, Resource)

The Retention Strategy finishes on 31st March and as I write this article it is not possible to get an accurate guide to who has qualified for the wonderful prizes due. Deputy Regional Commissioner Colin will collate all the information and compare the figures of 15th December last and after consultation with your DC we will announce the winners and members of the Region Commissioner's Team will visit Groups personally to present the prizes.

However from 1st April to 30th September 2005 our recruitment strategy is on again. Last year 30% of Groups qualified and received badges, footballs etc. The target has been agreed on again as a 10% increase. The prizes this year for all Sections (and yes Leaders too) will be a woggle. This was the recommendation of your Sectional Commissioner's. They will be attractive and meaningful. Nut's and bolt's issues you will be advised of shortly i.e.

commencement numbers and what your target for the year is. Let's see if we can't surpass last year and lift the cross bar to another level of achievement.

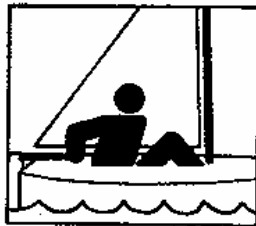

Equipment: Nil

How to Play:

All the players sit in a circle, with a viking chief nominated. Each must row their viking longship whilst making "heave ho!" noises. The player on either side of the chieftain should then row with the arm nearest to the chieftain making the same noise.

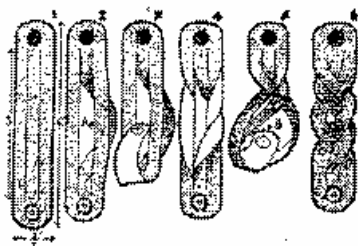
When the chieftain wishes to pass on the duties they should stand up and make a horn blowing noise and shoot an imaginary arrow at their choice for the new chieftain. The new chieftain takes up rowing duties and the players to their immediate left and right begin with single handed strokes.

Anyone who doesn't take up the challenge is out along with those using the wrong arm or who are too slow.

The game continues until there are 3 players left, these are the winners.

Things to do

Making a plaited woggle



You can make a new woggle by using a strip of leather and cutting slits in it as shown

In each diagram the shaded area indicated the front of the woggle

1. Fold the centre strip behind the right strip

2. Pass the bottom from the front through the gap marked A
3. You now have a weird looking plait as in diagram 4
4. Make another plait as shown in diagram 5 and again pass the bottom from the front through the gap marked b
5. Straighten up the completed plait and woggle is complete.

Cooking Ideas

Chocolate in Orange/Jaffa Cake

Description

Chocolate Cake cooked in an Orange Cooking Style Campfire (Embers)

Ingredients

12 oranges & 1 cake mix = approx 12 serves

Process Cut the orange in half. Squeeze juice from some halves. The youth use teaspoon or dessertspoon to scoop out flesh. Take care not to tear skin. Mix cheap chocolate cake mix with juice only, to moist cake batter.(not runny) spoon into one half of skin to 2/3 fill. Place on top half, then wrap in foil. Place on glowing embers for 10-15 min. Check with skewer. Best eaten warm. Works OK with plain cake mix, but better with chocolate. Source: "Barloo" from Scouts Australia Campsite Circle
