Growth Ideas for Your Group

10 great places to put your recruitment poster now are:

- Kindergartens
- Schools
- Libraries
- Shopping Centres
- Supermarket notice boards
- Health Centres

- Milk Bar windows
- Community notice boards
- Swimming Pools
- Fast Food outlets

Coordinate recruiting plans within your Group and District, including open night in your mob, pack and troop and School Night for Scouting.

Review to determine if your recruiting plans are working.

Make sure that at the time of recruitment, the Group Leader has new leader kit (available from Region Office), for new adult leaders and are informed of and committed to receiving basic training.

Estimate the approximate number of new Joeys, Cub Scouts and Scouts that will be added to each section. If you're Group needs help on the night, talk to our District Commissioner and District leaders but allow time for them to organise other leaders.

For best results, school recruiting visitations should take place only a few days before the open night.

Des Hocking Regional Commissioner for School Promotions should visit primary schools for classroom pep talks, inviting potential Joeys, Cubs, and Scouts to the open nights. Des has had very good results through out the Region will the School and recruiting new members.

Review the recruiting materials in the Group, (recruiting material is available to Group Leaders/Leaders in Charge from the Region Office).

Remember that the recruiting messages to boys/girls and parents are different. The message to boys/girls should be based on fun activities, outdoor activities, day camp, games, building things, etc. The message to parents, however, must be based on how Scouting develops lifelong values for their son or daughter.

Games

Catch the Coconuts

Equipment:- 4 tennis balls

Each group in lines, ball at feet of first Scout. At signal first Scout runs out to pre-selected spot 3-4 metres away and throws ball to second Scout. First Scout runs to end of line, second Scout runs out to 3-4 metre mark and throws to third Scout, etc. etc. Run through until each Scout has had two turns in the line which finishes first. If a Scout drops or misses a ball the ball must be returned to the thrower and thrown again until it is caught.

Shuffle the Emu Eggs

Equipment:- 4 tennis balls

Each group has a small ball and is lined up at one end of the hall. At signal first Scout in each line starts nudging the ball along until it reaches the other end of the hall, picks it up, runs back and puts it in front of No.2 who repeats the process etc.

Circle Cricket

Equipment: Ball

The players form two teams. One team stands in a large circle and the other team stands in a line. When the game starts the team in the circle pass the ball to each other around the circle. The other team have to run, one player at a time relay style, between two fixed markers. Each 'run' is noted. Once the ball has been passed around the circle a set amount of times (depends on the number of players) then

play stops the two teams swap round and repeat. The team with the highest score wins.

Further Details on how your Mob can register for this event will be sent out shortly.

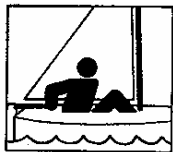

Welcome to 2008. I hope you all had a safe and happy Christmas. Well, Scouting has gotten off to a flying start this year. The Activities team had 2 events in January being a district day for the Upper Hunter which was a great event followed by the Scout Section Corroboree at Maitland Showground. Well the Corroboree would have been great if not for the weather!

This year brings 2 major Regional events:

I am sure that these 2 events will be written about by their organisers.

The next thing I will talk about is the district activities. I have included a BRAF for each district on the regional calendar. Each district has a given activity and date to work on. All applicants will need to complete a 'HA1 application to attend a course' form (available on the web). Numbers will be restricted so each district will need to consider this as the time gets closer. If the number of applicants is large the BRAF will run over 2 days with half on 1 day and the balance on the other. Note a BRAF is designed for the Scout section to expose them to the rope activities. Water courses are on the calendar and open to all (except white water – restricted due to risk).

Course costs have been held the same as last year. This can be achieved because the number of youth members

attending has remained high. Well done and encourage your youth members to come along. Again as a qualified leader, (who has a CoAL) you can do any activity on the regional activity calendar free. This is a great way for you to get the skills or improve your skills in an area. Then you can teach, assist etc with the training of your youth members or just do it for yourself. Scouting is for all of us. Come along and have a go – you never know you just might like it!

By now there should be a revised copy of the Regional Activities Calendar on the web. Any late changes will be included in the Bulletin each month.

INTERNATIONAL AND MEMBERS SUPPORT

Welcome to the New Year and the "Year of the Scout.!!" Undoubtedly ALL groups have big things planned for the year, beginning with the back to Groups special activity to kick off the New Year.

Australia Post will be issuing a series of stamps and first day covers in February. It is about 50 years since a Scouting Stamp was issued. Details can be obtained from Australia Post.

There are also a number of souvenirs available on the State web site

Plans are well underway for the Region Scoutfest in October. Keep your eyes on Greg Allen's reports.

There have been a number of changes to Parent and Leader Support Guides. These can be checked out on www.nsw.scouts.com.au

In February 2007 the Chief Commissioner instructed that every parent must be handed a copy of Parent Child Protection Guide. I would request that all Group Leaders and District Commissioners ensure that all existing parents and new parents are given a copy. It is for your protection as well as parents and youth.

If you do not have access to these sites please let me know and arrangements will be made for you to get the relevant material.

This guide must also be attached to every Y1 form. This is to meet new legal requirements to advise parents how to lodge a complaint.

I have had a number of enquiries lately from parents and leader concerning how to claim on the Association's Insurance Company for injuries resulting from Scouting Activities.

Firstly an Accident Incident report should be submitted as soon as possible after the accident/incident. On the Form is the address of the Associations insurers Willis. It is the responsibility of the Group Leader/Leader in Charge to inform the injured person of the Insurer and the means of

contact. It is also the injured persons responsibility to contact Willis to obtain the necessary claim forms. We do not have nor do we issue them! A representative of Willis will help the claimant with the filling out of the forms. All claimants need to understand that they will not be covered for all of their expenses. They must pay their accounts, make a claim on their Private Health Insurance and then forward all receipts and accounts together with the claim form to Willis. If you do not have Private Health Insurance then you should talk to Willis.

We do not fill in the claim forms, it is the responsibility of the claimant. I can assist if there are any difficulties by contacting the State Insurance person at State Office. If you have any enquiries re the above please contact me on **g.pricter@hotmail.net.au**
