The Regional Commissioner's Message



Growth 1 – Recruit ‘em

As I write this our 10% Growth Plan is moving to a closure on 31st October. The results so far are extremely encouraging and with less than one month to go, can only improve further. To give you some indication of why I am enthusiastic: approximately 2000 of our members have qualified for awards. This is out of 3131 total membership in the Region. Great stuff! Congratulations to all concerned.

Growth 2 – Keep ‘em (and build on that number too!)

On 1st November we will recommence our Keep your Mates Project which will run to 31st March 2006. The concept as last year is for your Group to at least retain your numbers over “summer”. We have some excellent prizes for the successful Groups. Your Group will very shortly receive promotional posters to assist you in driving this initiative. Please place them in a conspicuous location within your hall. It is very important your Youth Members understand and appreciate what we are trying to achieve. When you have a close look at our numbers it is of significant importance to look closely to the trends to see how we have been successful and more importantly, why and what we can do to continue the positive trends. Our Joey numbers at the moment are 314 which is easily the largest Joey Scout number in the State. Our Cub numbers are just over 1000 and these are both tremendous results. Our Scout and Venturer numbers have also shown growth but it is fair to say this is a clear and direct reflection on the growth of Joeys and Cubs. It is a fact that less than 7% join the Scout and Venturer Sections direct, so my friends with all due respect as they say “it’s not rocket science” to work out why we have been successful. Every Group I suggest should endeavour to have a Joey Mob. We have Groups that have

doubled and tripled their numbers by starting a Joey Mob. The help and support to commence these Mobs is available, Marilyn Hocking our Regional Commissioner (Joey Scouts) is waiting to help and is only too pleased to do so as is our Regional Commissioner (Cub Scouts) David Main in assisting any Cub Pack. If the Joeys are there, the parents are there, the future Leaders are there, the more 8 year old Cubs are there. The base of the Group is there. We must keep going forward! Let’s keep the flag flying! As I have said before, Scouting is like a fire if we don’t keep fuelling it, it will go out.

Growth 3 – How do we sustain it?

No preaching this time, just an observation. It is clear to me that successful Groups (eg Groups with 50 plus members) generally each have a Joey Mob as a part of their Group, conversely many struggling Groups don’t have a Mob. A coincidence? No, I don’t believe so. How are your Group’s numbers?

Region Visits in 2006

We have locked in with your District Commissioner already dates for next year’s Region Visit to each District. If you have any positive suggestions or criticism to improve our Visits, we welcome your input.

Using (very local) Resources

Selected Members of the Region Team have been working directly with struggling Groups. I am pleased to say that there have been some positive turnarounds. This concept will be continued indefinitely. To be honest, I don’t think we will ever get it 100% right, but we are out there, trying. If we can help your Group in any way irrespectively what the problem is, I personally guarantee that it will happen. It is a matter of asking through your respective Group Leader to the District Commissioner. Don’t continue to struggle; help will be on the way.

Cub Scout Capers



The planning for 2006 should be in full swing to put the “out” into Cub Scouting. Don’t be an isolationist! try to attend some of the events, which are put on to help you. Consider how your Pack could benefit from the exposure to a wider range of activities than just those run by your Pack.

“**Cubs on the Move**”- You are asking what this is? “Cubs on the Move” is an initiative to help small to medium size Packs. During the last term of 2005 each DCSL and I will be trying to contact as many of the Cub Leaders associated with these Packs to find out their views on a range of issues. Early in 2006 my team and selected Cub Leaders will put a series of short term programs together for the Packs in question. It is envisaged that the program sheets will have detailed information for the leader use. The information will be distributed to all Cub Leaders on CD (free of charge). If you have suggestions on how we can help you, call your DCSL or myself.

“**Bring A Friend 06**”- Is on the books again; this time we have incorporated the suggestions that you have made. The program is still the same and will start in second term and finish with the Cuboree. Remember the Cubs have to be registered to attend the Cuboree and this is also a good recruitment for potential leaders. Packs are welcome to submit designs for the “06 Bring A Friend Badge” entries to be received by 1st February. Give your design to your DCSL. The chosen design will receive a certificate for their Pack and a gift voucher from Camping World for themselves at the Regional Cuboree.

The State Cub Commissioner’s Recognition Bar - Will be available to Cub Leaders next year. The yearly award is designed to recognize the efforts of the Cub Leaders with their Packs. This is a “give me”. All you have to do is what you are supposed to do and find the time to sit down with me and provide a copy of the evidence to me to support the Challenge. There is a list of 20 items and you select 15 and the “Cub Leaders Challenge” will be yours. The Cub Leader challenge sheet will be distributed soon to the DCSLs.

The Cub Leadership Course - These courses will be run by the Region again next year as per the agreement at the State Cub Conference. The Cub Leadership badge is a restricted item and can only be awarded on completion of a Region run course and the Cub completing the set requirements. The Region has set aside four weekends next year, a Saturday session and a Sunday session with a maximum of 30 people each session. Cubs can attend any of the planned dates, no matter their location.

Your Label

Smart shoppers read the labels when they go to the supermarket. Product labels tell them a number of things: Whether the can or package contains beans, corn, flour, or pork chops; what ingredients it contains; what it costs; the weight of the product. The label also carries the trademark of the manufacturer. You may learn a lot by reading labels.

In Scouting, we carry around our own labels. The uniform itself is a kind of label. It tells people that we are Scouts and that we are trying to live by the Scout Law and Promise. If they know anything about Scouting, the badges we wear are labels, too. The badges describe some of the ingredients that make up your package - how far you have progressed and whether you're a leader.

How well does your label describe the contents of your package? Can it be said of you: "The enclosed package lives up to the Law and Promise? He is prepared to help in emergencies and does a good turn daily?"

And is it true that the badge of rank you wear honestly reflects your Scouting skills? I'm quite sure it does because we don't give badges to who haven't earned them.

Wear your label, your uniform and its badges, proudly. And remember that it tells a lot about you and about your pledge to the Scout Law and Promise.

Some Resources for You:

Activity

Clown Face Makeup

White base options:

1. Mix equal parts of liquid face cleansing cream and sifted powdered sugar.
2. Using a fork, mix one tablespoon shortening and two tablespoons cornstarch until creamy.
3. Or, cover face with Vaseline and powder with several applications of talc or cornstarch. Be sure not to breathe while powdering.

Rubber noses are available at many novelty or craft stores. Eyebrow pencil, lipstick, and eye shadow may be used to enhance the features. Eyebrow pencil darkens or changes the shape of the eyebrows. Exaggerate the mouth with lipstick and outline with eyebrow pencil. Add yarn hair or silly hat

to top off your clown character. A section of panty hose, knotted at one end makes a good skull cap in which to cover your own hair.

Games

Clown Walk

Players are evenly divided into two teams. A starting line and finish line about 30 feet apart are marked. Each team forms a unit by holding hands, interlocking arms, riding piggyback, or by any other means that can be devised. The only limitation are the number of arms and legs which may be used for the task of walking. The number of arms and legs which can be used in the walking process are determined by subtracting two from the total number of people on the team. (For example, if there are eight people on the team, six arms and six legs may be used.) To start the race, both teams assemble on the starting line. On signal, they move toward the finish line. The first team to arrive wins.

Scout's Nose

Prepare a number of paper-bags, all alike, and put in each a different smelling article, such as chopped onion in one, coffee in another, rose-leaves, leather, aniseed, violet powder, orange peel and so on. Put these packets in a row a couple of feet apart, and let each competitor walk down the line and have five seconds' sniff at each. At the end he has one minute in which to write down or to state to the umpire the names of the different objects smelled, from memory, in their correct order.

Game Type: Indoor

Submarine Dive

Equipment: Piece of chalk

Formation: Scatter

Draw a number of small chalk circles - submarines - around the room with one less than the number members.

The members hop, walk or run round the room according to the direction given by the leader. When he calls 'Submarine Dive!' each member tries to get into a submarine. The one member who is left out stays on a submarine for the next game and so gradually the submarines become occupied. The winner is the one who gains the last vacant submarine.

This is all great stuff, however but if you find you are not getting the support you need then you need to let your Group Leader, District Team or Regional Team know what you need (many of us are not mind readers).

Support - I have consistently said over many years that for training to be effective that it needs to be supported at Group level surprisingly the latest National e- newsletter supports this. Ian Langford-Brown who is the Chairman - National Executive Committee states the following "We Need Our Scout Coaches. Our Scout Groups are the fundamental units of the Movement. At Group level, the youth section leaders take on the essence of Scouting – delivery of consistently high quality Scout Programs to our youth members, our young Australians, our Scouts. The role of all other adults in Scouting is to essentially help and support them. How? By visiting, supporting, encouraging, training, showing them how, listening and providing a perpetual sounding board, being an advocate for the youth sections, minimising their administrative load and so on. In other words, doing everything possible to help youth section leaders be effective. That is the role of Group Leaders, District Leaders, Commissioners and Trainers. It is why we have these support and advocacy roles. Most people learn "on the job". That is why our Group Leaders and District Leaders are so vital. Group Leaders, with the Group Chairman and Committee, manage the affairs of the Group to ensure it has the resources and back-up needed to support the leaders and see that they are trained and resourced.
