The Regional Commissioner's Message



Getting the Word Out

I often enjoy roaming through past copies of "Scouting in NSW" magazine, in particular copies from the 1950's, 60's and 70's.

I was at our Region Scout Heritage Centre at Fassifern looking for something specific when I read a copy from 1959. The foreword in this magazine was written by the then Chief Commissioner of the time, the late Sir Vincent Fairfax and he talks about communication especially within a Group environment. He says that frequently we get the lines "nobody told me it was on" and / or "I would have come if only I knew about it" or "It's news to me" etc. I couldn't help but think not too much has changed and indeed I almost rechecked the date! He interestingly further offered that Scouting is not just an administrative process and if we expect people to participate, this is largely governed by our capacity to personally engage with people and to inspire and enthuse them. You might say that it's called leadership.

Just recently as you are well aware, we held a very successful Regional Centenary celebration which was indeed very well attended. However, some of the feedback we got from some Groups about their lack of knowledge about this event could only be described as 'bizarre'. Frankly, one is entitled to be incredulous about such claims. You see my friends, I am happy to be challenged or chastised if anyone can demonstrate where Region has failed to 'get the message' out there. The problem by and large is inside the Group, mainly brought about by either the ineffectiveness of or even the lack of Group Council Meetings (where all Leaders are present under the chair of the Group Leader / Leader in Charge). You would have to be on another planet not to know the

details of the recent Region Centenary Event. The standard line these days seems to be "I'll fling them an email". That might be OK but how do you know that they got it and do you know what (if anything) have they done about it? Nothing takes the place of personal contact. The ability and capacity to enthuse others to have "some" people use the line that "nobody told them" to compensate for their inability to perform. As Sir Vincent stated that at least it would be better if people said "I know about it but unfortunately I was unavailable".

What is YOUR Group Doing to Retain Members this Summer?

We are about to embark on our annual membership retention strategy between 1 December and 31 March next. This time we (and eight other Regions in NSW which is great news) are in the process of having a special scarf designed which will be able to be worn next year as a part of the Celebration of 100 Years of Australian Scouting. It will be unique, special and different and indeed will be a collector's item. Something that I'm sure that youth and leaders alike would want. However "the deal" is simple, your Group must retain and even better still, increase its numbers in that period (ie 1 December 2007 to 31 March 2008). Even with a Quarterly Membership Fee Billing system we collectively failed abysmally in that area with a loss of 250 people during February and March 2007 inclusive. Every Group via your District Commissioner have been asked to have a retention strategy which will be implemented locally. Now I know that I've said it ad-nauseum but the youth are not just going to automatically turn up on 1 February. One DC suggested (somewhat tongue in cheek of course) that we lock them in the Hall from Christmas time! But seriously let's embark upon this initiative with gusto and enthusiasm that it deserves. A great way to start this initiative and which will give you a barrier for some tolerance with your population numbers is to register more people now to offset any loss over the Summer Break and thus ensure that all get a scarf. Yes, we want everyone to get a scarf, so much so that every youth member will get a copy of the promotional flyer that we are now producing. Please all see the information attached as a flyer in this Bulletin to see how your Group, by registering two extra youth members, can go in the draw for an opportunity to win a great prize.

Vale Jean Nellie Hattander

Jeannie Hattander began her Scouting Career at age 14 when she was asked to help out with 1st Marks Point Cub Pack. It was not very long after that the leader left to go interstate and Jeannie became the underage Cub Leader.

At 18 years she became officially warranted as Cub Leader, a position she held for 16 years. In 1972 the Association adopted the "New Design" which meant that the influence of the Jungle Book was all but eliminated. This did not happen at 1st Marks Point. Jeannie believed that if B-P wanted the Jungle theme then that was good enough for her and that was the way she ran her Pack all those years. Many a DC pulled their hair out trying to change her but she wouldn't budge. As a single lady the Cub Pack was her family and if anyone criticised her boys then they had to take the consequences.

In 1987 she was appointed as District Cub Leader and in 1988 was appointed as the first female District Commissioner in the Hunter Area. She now had over 200 children to mother and she set about doing just that. She married John Hattander at this time and boasted that if he wanted to marry her he needed to be a leader and this he did.

She realised that she knew little of the other sections and so as well as her Cub Wood Badge she also completed a Group Leader Wood Badge and Scout Wood Badge and did warrant level training in the Venturer Section. She completed her Green Cord in the Scout Section simply to learn how the Scout Section worked. She also completed a Training of Trainers Course and a PLA Course.

In 1997 she was appointed as RC (Cub Scouts). Jeannie was a very well organised person, a good communicator but she had some unusual ideas which suited the Cub Section and her reign as RC (Cubs) was punctuated with great Cub activities.

In 1988 she had to resign as RC(Cubs) because of work commitments and was appointed as an Honorary Commissioner in the Region. She did not put up her feet however and took up a Layside position just to help out.

In 2005 she was appointed as Regional Chairman. John became her assistant and as a team they threw themselves into the task. The B-P Birthday Bash was her baby and she set that event on a sound footing for years to come.

In 2006 she was awarded her 45 year Service Decoration and in 2007 the Silver Kangaroo. This award was presented by Steve Fernie the day before she died. Jeannie fought her cancer with much courage but it eventually caught up with her on Sunday 16th September. Jeannie will be sadly missed and Scouting and the World is a much poorer place today because she is no longer with us.

Jean Nellie Hattander has gone home.

The International letter lasts for two years. If you go again within the two years please notify using the same form so that the Association in the country you are going to can be informed and we know where you are.

Any leaders and youth members and this includes Rovers and Venturers should notify Region when they are going to an overseas event or participating in part of their award scheme that takes them overseas. Smoke Signals

JOTA/JOTI 2007

I went along to JOTA/JOTI weekend held at Nord's Wharf, what a great weekend packed full of activities. Thanks to Fay Pritchard from Charlestown for organising this event, Bill (Blinky) from 1st Mayfield looking after the computers, Gianni from Cardiff looking after the radios, and to all the other leaders organising other activities for the youth to take part in.

Games

Circle Football

Equipment: Basketball

The players form a circle with the Scout who is "It" in the middle. A basketball is thrown from one to the other around the circle and the Scout in the centre tries to touch it. If he is successful, the last Scout to touch it is now "It." If the ball goes outside the circle the director is to get it. No Scout may move his feet or break the circle.

Little and Large

Equipment: Large and small ball

Players stand in a large circle around the leader. The small ball is passed around the circle from player to player. The leader passes the large ball to a player at random who must return it to the leader. If any player drops either ball or passes the wrong one they are out and sit down. Play continues until only one player is left.

Fill the Gap

Equipment: None

The players stand in a large circle. One player walks around the outside of the circle and touches a player on the shoulder. Then both of these players must run around the circle in opposite directions until they reach the gap in the circle. The last player to reach the gap must walk around the outside of the circle and touch someone else.

Skittle Ball

Equipment:Ball: 2 or more Skittles, Chalk

Play in 2 teams. At each end of the hall a large square is drawn and a skittle placed in the middle of this square. Each team has to try to knock over the opposing teams skittle by throwing the ball. Each skittle knocked over scores 1 point. If anyone steps in either square a point is awarded to the other team. You cannot move when you have the ball, you must pass it. No contact is allowed between players. Play continues until a point/time limit.

Cooking

Onion Oven

Cut an onion in half and scoop out all but the two outside layers. Crack an egg into each half, or fill with chopped, seasoned meat, cap, and place directly on hot coals.

Stick Bread

Press a wad of dough onto the end of a stick and bake over hot coals. Try cinnamon twists. Pat dough into a rectangle, spread with butter, cinnamon and brown sugar, and cut into 2" strips. Wrap strip around a green stick and toast over the coals.
