## The Regional Commissioner's Message

Ken Bayliss and his team need to be hearty congratulated for their effort, time, commitment and more importantly on this occasion, for their resilience. It would have been easy to cancel the event but they persevered and all participants had a great day.

### Promote, Promote, Promote! – (Visibility)

I know you are probably not really interested at what I eat but recently I was in Henny Penny Wallsend store buying a chicken. Would you believe! I noticed 24 coloured signs right around the walls of the shop with a family treat promotion. These 24 signs took up almost all the available wall and window space of the shop. ## Adventurous Activities



The Regional visits with Steve Fernie have gone well so far. The support of District leaders in the development of activities is very welcome. One of the questions that was raised during these visits is the ability for line leaders to do courses. The current regional policy is that any leader is welcome to attend any activity training course (assuming they meet the prerequisite). All qualified leaders can attend these courses free (do not need to pay the course fees). Any fees associated with camping and transport etc need to be paid. The activity team is committed to supporting line leaders in the development of quality program in activities. The team is available to assist at district level. This however must be coordinated through the DC.

It is time to start planning the Activities calendar for next year. Each year the activities team is committed to running a BRAF for the Scout section in each District. The areas covered are rock related and include abseiling, rock climbing and caving. These should be rotated so that a Scout will get exposed to each activity over a three-year period. The nomination for these courses should be through the District Commissioner or District Leader Scouts. Please look at your yearly calendars and suggest some suitable times for these courses and talk to me soon. Remember the cooler months are good for these courses.

Please remember that all activity course application forms (HA1) are required at least 3 weeks before the course start date. These forms and money must be in the Region Office by the closing date. We are currently looking at the possibility of getting credit facilities at the Region Office that will allow the ability of faxing forms and payment details to the Region Office. Once this is finalised I will notify you of the new procedures.

All application forms must be **signed** by their own SECTIONAL Leader from their GROUP and the PARENT (for youth members under 18 years old). Also note that it is illegal to post cash. If you intend to post your application form into the Office then you must attach a cheque.

### **Why Am I a Leader?**

#### Author Unknown

I'm not a Scout Leader for the easy hours, high pay, parents' gratitude, power or prestige. I'm a Leader because I want the world for your son or daughter or mine. I want to help them learn to finish anything they start and do it well and to guide them to know their self-worth with a deeper understanding of themselves. I want to help shape men and women who have strength of character and are sensitive to the needs of others. I want them to be the best they can be - whether as career people or tradesmen, young adults who are the hearts of the family. In giving my time and myself I reap rewards far beyond what I give. I receive a better world for my children and future generations. I'm a Scout Leader because I care.

### **Games**

#### HUMAN BOAT RACE

Each boat is made up of eight to ten players each in full knees-bent position. Each player has his hands on the shoulders of the man in front. Facing the line of players in each boat is a 'COX'. The cox holds the hands of the front player in the boat. When the race starts, the boats move forwards by all players in a boat springing together off both feet. The cox for each boat shouts encouragement for his team and calls out the rhythm for the spring. During the race, any boat that breaks up into two or more parts is deemed to have sunk and is disqualified from the race.

### DONKEY RACE

Two scouts straddle a broomstick, back to back. On signal, one runs forward and the other runs backwards about 15mtrs. They then run back to the starting line, but this time they change positions (forward becomes backward runner) then the next two team members go.

### COOKING

#### Eggs MacSanches

#### POT

2 eggs

bacon bits

onion flakes

flour tortillas

1 slice cheese or shredded cheese

salsa sauce

1 Quart Freezer Zip type bag.

The heavy freezer bags are needed, not the regular. In the freezer bag place the eggs - minus the shells. Add the bacon, salsa, and onion. Add a little water or milk ~1/8 cup or 2 Tablespoons. Zip up tight and mix the eggs and ingredients by fingering vigorously. Scramble in the bag. Place the bag in a boiling pot of water and cook until done. Remove from pot, if no leaks, use the water for hot chocolate or clean-up. Scoop the eggs on the flour tortillas and add some cheese, fold and eat. Makes fillings for about 2 tortillas.
